SLC *Guidelines*

<u>After registration</u> – get settled under the direction of your chaperone and then go to the dining hall for dinner by 17:00. The opening session begins at 19:00 in the Theater.

Wear your name tag to all sessions, discussion sessions and meals so others can get to know you and call you by name.

<u>All meals</u> will be at the cafeteria. Don't forget to BRING YOUR NAME TAG with you as it also serves as your meal ticket! Please wait patiently for your turn at meals, do not skip the line - if you would like to join your group, join BEFORE standing in the line. Please DO NOT take meals out of the dining hall for yourself or others. Be a good witness to the servers. Give thanks in prayer on your own and enjoy your meal.

Follow the schedule carefully. Be on time for all activities and sessions. One mark of a good leader is that he knows how to be a conscientious and supportive follower. Encourage each other and show appreciation to others who make helpful contributions to discussions, etc. Be patient when communicating because English is not the first language for all of you.

Expectations at the conference:

- All students are expected to attend meals and follow each part of the schedule, including the designated time for "lights out". Rest, food and water are basic elements needed for our emotional and physical health. A lack of sleep will rob us of valuable learning opportunities and may disturb many others who need rest.
- The meal times are important times to get to know others as well as reenergize.
- All students are expected to meet with chaperones daily to review the day, pray together and work on their Student Action Plan. This plan must be presented on Friday evening.

To benefit from the main sessions and workshops:

- Be willing to ask questions when you don't understand.
- Think about how this teaching or idea applies to your life and circumstances.
- Use the new information soon so that you will remember it by teaching someone else or applying it to something you face now.

To benefit from the student discussion groups:

- You must be willing to be uncomfortable! If you love to talk listen! If you are shy talk! This is the only way you can learn together and grow.
- Don't assume you have the only answer OR that your idea is not important. Your answer is always important but the purpose of the group is to share ideas and learn from each other.
- You must be at all your group's sessions and use all of your time! You can't benefit from the group unless you are participating with active listening and sharing.
- Prepare for each discussion by looking over the questions and understanding them first in your own language. This will be a big help!
- It is OK to have a different opinion than others. Each person is at their own stage of growth and understanding AND we come from different religious backgrounds and cultures.
- Have fun! This is a unique opportunity to build incredible friendships with others from around the world!
- * Practice behavior that keeps you safe and under control (e.g. recreation time), is respectful of the camp property and is considerate of others at all times. Be respectful of adults because they are here to guide and encourage you.
- * Be respectful and modest with your choice of clothing.
- * Sign out and return any borrowed recreation equipment (otherwise you will need to pay for replacement).
- * Remain on the grounds throughout the conference.
- * Stay out of rooms of the opposite sex
- * Avoid smoking and other harmful practices.

* Violation of these guidelines will be viewed seriously.

Personal Devotion Time

There are many different ways you can engage with the Bible and allow the Holy Spirit to apply it to your heart. Here are some suggestions:

- Pray for God's direction as you read His Word.
- Focus on the parts of the Scripture passage that stand out.
- Use the question provided to help with application.
- Write out your thoughts.

Thursday – Hebrews 11:17-31

What difference did living "by faith" make in the lives of the people mentioned in this passage? What conclusions or implications can you draw for your own life?

Prayer Suggestion: Ask God to help you to live and lead "by faith".

Friday – Psalm 34

What promises of God's comfort and protection in this Psalm speak most clearly to your heart and soul this morning?

Prayer Suggestion: Thank God for his comfort and protection in your life. If you are feeling burdened by something in particular, cry out to Him with your troubles.

Saturday – Matthew 6:19-33

What things make you worry the most? How does this passage encourage you to view those things?

Prayer Suggestion: Ask God to help you trust Him in the midst of your worries.

Workshop Dverview

Workshops at the Student Leadership Conference each year provide a practical and interactive setting for leadership development. All workshops are taught by teachers who care deeply about your growth as a leader and will do their best to answer your questions from a Biblical perspective.

This year student workshops have 4 areas of focus:

Leading Myself – Who is the leader and why do they lead? **Building Relationships** – How do leaders connect with people? **Leading People** – How do leaders promote a culture of collaboration, creativity and commitment? Driving Results – How do leaders work toward a goal?

Please be aware of these options and think carefully with your school team about which workshops will be most helpful for your group and your school. Chaperones should not attend student workshops.
