Chaperone Commitment

Chaperones play an important role in the lives and growth of the students that they bring to SLC and have the opportunity to grow and be a blessing to other school groups. ACSI Europe is committed to partnering with chaperones – supporting them in their role as teachers and mentors and benefiting from their valuable skills and experience. In order to partner effectively and ensure that SLC is a valuable and safe experience for everyone, we ask that all chaperones make the following commitment.

As a chaperone I purpose to ...

- **Be responsible for the supervision of the students from my school at all times**, ensuring that they abide by the SLC guidelines as printed in the conference booklet.

 ACSI Europe staff will do everything possible to maintain a safe environment during the conference, but the responsibility for student behavior remains with the chaperones.
- Ensure that my students participate in all aspects of the program, including plenary sessions, discussion group times, workshops, debriefing and school interaction times.

 Students who are absent from sessions or activities are not benefiting from the full value of the program and are missing the opportunity to invest in the lives of others. They could also be creating a safety concern.
- Encourage my students to step out of their comfort zone by making new friends with students from other cultural backgrounds, listening to viewpoints different to their own and asking thoughtful questions.
- Participate in plenary sessions, briefing sessions and workshop sessions for chaperones (other than when facilitating a student workshop). These sessions are important for our own growth as teachers and mentors, networking and mutual encouragement, and for receiving important information and updates during the conference.
- **Meet with my students during the school debriefing times** (Wed evening, Thursday evening, Friday afternoon). These are important times for interacting with my students, hearing how God has been speaking to them, offering support and guidance, and building unity amongst my group. Guidance for carrying out this important role is provided to you by ACSI Europe in your chaperone information packet when you register for the conference. There is also opportunity to ask questions during the chaperone briefing sessions.
- **Set a good example of Christ-like servant leadership** to all students by my attitudes, words and behavior throughout the conference.
